REACH

Our core programs serve people of all ages and socio-economic backgrounds with a deep impact in the western suburbs. Our children's programs reach the cities of Minnetonka, Hopkins, Excelsior, Shorewood, Deephaven, Woodland, and Greenwood. We are especially needed by individuals and families who do not meet eligibility criteria for state and county assistance programs or other nonprofit agencies.

BUILDING STRONG COMMUNITIES

To create healthy and vibrant communities, residents need to be able to access pathways out of poverty. Our program model provides access to resources that promote foundational stability in addition to empowering individuals and families to move towards self-sufficiency. As a well-known entity in the community, we have the relationships to meet emerging needs.



PROGRAMS

Children and Youth Programs

Provide free school supplies, winter gear and gifts for the holidays for any family that attends the Hopkins and Minnetonka School Districts.

Social Service Programs

Case Management

ResourceWest's case managers help families stabilize their situation, and continue to work with them to move to greater stability.

Emergency Bridge Assistance

These one-time emergency grants are most often related to transportation challenges (e.g. gas cards, bus fare cards, car repairs, etc) and healthcare (e.g. HMO premium payments, prescriptions, etc).

Information and Referral Service


Staff answers questions and offers referrals to other agencies that assist with food, clothing, shelter, healthcare, etc.


